









What do you believe?

This film is a far cry longer than the standard festival short, and more technically complicated than a student work probably should be. I chose to tackle such an ambitious project nearly solo to teach myself production arts I was not fully acquainted with: sound design, CGI & VFX, color grading, music production, among others. The spacewalk sequence accompanied by original gothic music which concludes the film took over a year to produce on its own. Much like October changes and finds new meaning through the film, I found myself and my perception of this project's themes changing drastically over the nearly 3 year production.






Will Schwarz Writer, Director, DOP




Kayla Laird




Caitlin Lenz

How did you come up with this madness?

I had a strange series of dreams during the pandemic when I was spending about 24 hours a day alone in my dorm room listening to the choral music of Estonian composer Arvo Pärt. The ending is as close an actualization of those images as I could create. Exaltation, to me, is a reflection on body dysmorphia, queer identity, the role of artists, and what it means to dream of worlds other than the one we inhabit.

Probably when my parents failed to mention that "Cinema isn't a real degree" and "you'll never make it in the real world." I could have been a doctor.

What was the best part of production?

Spending nearly a year learning computer animation for just 3 minutes of footage was a lot of fun, to say the least.

I hope audiences are intrigued by the visuals and find meaning in the more experimental aspects. Surreal films always excite me as a viewer because they leave so much open to interpretation; no reading is more or less interesting than another - whatever they take away is fantastic and I'd love to hear their thoughts.
